
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Origins of FAIR Health

Primary Components of the Negotiated Settlement




Establish an independent not-for-profit organization

 - Invalid Zip Code
 - Incorrectly Reported Charges
 - Modifiers
- Methodology
 - Outlier Methodology
 - Median Absolute Deviation
 - Negative Values
 - Unit Thresholds


